Multi-Systemic Therapy (MST) Success Story

MST recently served an adolescent male who was referred to the department on terroristic threat, assault on a public servant, criminal activity, criminal mischief and drug possession. During our work with the family, the caregiver was able to create a structured environment where the youth was less likely to re-offend and more likely to be successful. The family was able to generalize their new skills and take accountability for the youth's behavior. When the caregiver was taken in a tragic accident, an extended family member was able to re-create the previous success with the youth. Successful outcomes are achieved through the teamwork between the program, probation, and the family!

ACS/PDFRP Success Story

PD/FRP provided services to a youth referred for behaviors including: runaway; substance abuse; and truancy. In addition, there was evident family conflict. The parents were frustrated with the youth's negative behaviors and the family lacked communication. PD/FRP and the family were able to develop safety plans to increase youth's compliance, educational success, family communication, and anger coping skills. Mom was able to increase her follow through and consistency with effective rewards and consequences, which resulted in improved family relationships. The youth completed successfully by working, attending church and school, passing all classes, and eliminating drug use. The youth's greatest success was having a closer relationship with her parents at the end of the program.
